

A peaceful protest by Piggy Banks against Transperth's SmartRider card ended in a violent confrontation today. Frustration turned to anger when the Piggy Banks discovered that more than 70% of regular travellers now use SmartRider cards instead of saving their loose

The self-appointed leader of the Piggy Banks described the situation as outrageous.

"If you don't need to save your change, you don't need a Piggy Bank, do you?" he said. "Piggy Banks live for change, that's all we do, and now some of us are being used to collect buttons. It's a disgrace."

David Hynes, from Transperth, further inflamed the volatile situation by saying that the Piggy Banks were behaving like greedy pigs.

right change to buy a ticket, or queuing to buy it, when you have a SmartRider," he said. "You can save 15% or 25% on regular travel just by using your SmartRider instead, so who needs a


Piggy Bank?"


